School of Parapsychology and Spiritual Esoteric Studies Master of Indigenous Religious Studies Standards for Graduation

Graduation from the Parapsychology and Spiritual Esoteric Education Program is granted when you provide evidence of being prepared to practice the metaphysical teaching profession. This evidence is more than spending a certain length of time in training and completing designated courses. Evidence of being prepared to teach metaphysics emphasizes spiritual, mental, and emotional maturity; devotion to a life-style of service to others; metaphysical, spiritual and intellectual clarity about the purpose and meaning of the metaphysical teaching profession; and the demonstrated skills to work effectively with people, organize one's own life, and understand administrative responsibilities appropriate to your chosen field of service. Specific requirements are:

- 1. The satisfactory completion of the CIAMSS Bachelor of Parapsychology and Spiritual Esoteric Studies or Certified equivalent
- 2. The Satisfactory completion a minimum of 33.5 credits of work over a minimum period of two calendar years.
- 3. The Satisfactory completion of a professionally bound thesis of at least 25,000 words or an additional 6 credit hours of course work.
- 4. Any additional requirements that the faculty may assess as a result of reviews of conferences.
- 5. All work counted toward the hours required for graduation must be completed with the grade of E (excellent) or S (satisfactory).
- 6. Evidence of such metaphysical, spiritual, mental, and emotional maturity as will support the judgment, by the faculty, of your readiness and fitness as a metaphysical teacher.
- 7. Recommendation of the faculty.

Graduation from the CIAMSS Parapsychology/SpiritualEsoteric Education Program does not mean automatic certification as a metaphysical practitioner, teacher, or administrator. A student who successfully completes the prescribed two-year course of study shall receive a degree entitled Master of Indigenous Studies.
